LAUNCH OF THE CHERISHING SIDMOUTH CEMETERIES PROJECT

Jeremy Woodward gave a presentation, focusing on the history & background from 2020, including the initial proposals for implementing the plan and the proposal for a supporters' group; before considering current ideas on developing a management plan from oct/nov and looking to bring together visions with photos and the new website.

In the ensuing discussion, it was pointed out that many of the photos of wild flowers are from spring, whilst the current view of the Sidmouth Cemetery is much more overgrown. It was made clear that the success of a group would require considerable dedication, from volunteers and a steering group, and by working closely with the council, over several years. However, it was appreciated that the moment had arrived when a move should be made to set up a group; subsequently ten attendees signed up to take the project forward.
